
UTILITY BILLING CHANGES

In September of 2021, a new utility bylaw was passed. The rate structures found within were designed to be affordable without sacrificing the Town's ability to provide water and sewer to residents well into the future.

Beginning this year, the residential basic minimum water allowance will decrease from 50 cubic meters to 40 cubic meters. The cost will remain the same as 2022: \$92 for water and \$48 for sewer. Based on average usages, most customers will see no change to their bill. Those who choose to use more water than the basic minimum will be charged per cubic meter at 2022's rate: \$2.20 for water and \$1.25 for sewer.

Water leaks can arise and continue undetected. Unsealed toilet flappers are a common culprit. We strongly encourage all users to check for leaks frequently so that they are not paying for water they do not intend to use. To help residents with this task, all utility accounts are reviewed for abnormal usage patterns every billing cycle. If any are found, the account holder is contacted.
