TOWN COUNCIL ELECTIONS ARE THIS NOVEMBER

Have you ever thought about joining Town Council?

WHAT DOES A COUNCILLOR DO?

Councillors are responsible to:

- represent the public and consider the well-being and interests of the municipality
- participate in the development and evaluation of policies, services, and programs
- participate in council and committee meetings
- ensure administrative practices and procedures are in place to implement the decisions of council
- maintain the confidentiality of matters, until discussed at a meeting held in public
- maintain the financial integrity of the municipality

WHAT DOES A MAYOR DO?

The Mayor performs all duties of Councillors, and:

- chairs all council meetings

WHO CAN RUN FOR COUNCIL?

You can run for Council if you are at least 18 years old, are a Canadian citizen, have lived in Saskatchewan for the past 6 months, and have lived in Maidstone for 3 consecutive months prior to submitting your nomination package.

WHAT IS THE TIME COMMITMENT FOR BEING ON COUNCIL?

A term of office is 4 years. During that term, Council has roughly two council meetings each month and each member of council may have additional meetings for the respective committees that they sit on. The Town recognizes the value of our Council members, and they do receive remuneration for their time spent at meetings, workshops and conferences.

HOW DO I GET NOMINATED AS AN ELECTION CANDIDATE?

To be nominated, you must submit a nomination package to the Administrator at the Town Office. This package will include a public disclosure statement and a nomination form that must be signed by the nominee and 5 eligible Maidstone voters. Nomination packages will be available at the Town Office, and online at www.townofmaidstone.com in early September when the Call for Nominations is advertised.

IMPORTANT DATES:

Wednesday, October 9, 2024 – Nomination Day – closes at 4 p.m.

The nomination period will open in early September. All nominations must be received at the Town Office by 4 p.m. on Wednesday, October 9, 2024.

Wednesday, October 30, 2024 – Advance Poll – 12 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Wednesday, November 13, 2024 – Election Day – 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.
