



PAYMENT METHODS

- 1) **E-transfer** – townofmaidstone4@sasktel.net
Please remember to include your account # in the memo
- 2) **Bill Payee thru a Financial Institution**
CIBC: “Maidstone (Town of) Taxes” or “Maidstone (Town of) Utilities”. Please use your account number and add zeros either before or after as you may need to enter a total of 9 to 11 digits.
Credit Union: “Maidstone (Town):Property Tax” or “Maidstone (Town): Utilities”. Please use your account number and add zeros either before or after so that you are entering a total of 9 digits.
- 3) **Cash** – in-person at the Town Office
- 4) **Cheque** – in-person at the Town Office, in the drop box, or mailed to Box 208, Maidstone, SK S0M 1M0
- 5) **Debit** – in-person
- 6) **Credit** – in-person or over the phone (a 3% fee applies to all credit card payments)

YARD WASTE PICKUP

Pickups occur every Thursday.
Please leave your bags in your alley; if you don't have an alley, please leave it on the street.

Please remember to:

Use clear plastic bags
No bags heavier than 40 lbs
No garbage

Final pickup will be November 6, 2025.

CATS & DOGS

The town has had several complaints about cats roaming and leaving feces in neighbors flower beds and lawns, As well as dogs getting away on their owners and roaming.

This is a reminder that as per the towns Bylaw, no animal shall leave the property of its owner without being suitably leashed and under the control of a person capable of restraining the animal.

If an unregistered cat or dog is trapped and impounded by the Town owners will receive fines of at least \$300.

Failure to license an animal **\$50**
Failure to display an animal tag **\$50**
Permitting an animal to be at large;
\$200 1st offense
\$250 2nd offense
\$300 all subsequent offences

Permitting animal excrement on private property **\$100**
Daily impound fee **\$40**
